SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1 Description of First Aid Measures:

Eye: Flush eyes with water for several minutes, while holding the eyelids apart. Get medical attention if irritation occurs and persists.

Skin: Wash thoroughly with soap and water for several minutes. Get medical attention if irritation occurs and persists. Remove and launder clothing before re-use.

4.2 Most Important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed: Direct contact may cause mild eye irritation. Direct contact may cause slight skin irritation. Inhalation may cause respiratory tract irritation.

4.3 Indication of any immediate medical attention and special treatment needed: Immediate medical attention is not required.

SECTION 5: FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

5.1 Extinguishing Media: Use any media that is suitable for the surrounding fire.

5.2 Special Hazards Arising from the Substance or Mixture: This product is not flammable or combustible but will burn under fire conditions. Thermal decomposition may release oxides of carbon.

5.3 Advice for Fire-Fighters: Firefighters should wear positive pressure self-contained breathing apparatus and full protective clothing. Cool fire exposed containers with water spray. Contain water used in fire incidences involving the undiluted product.
